It probably took us 2 hours. They have a lot of blueberries that have yet to ripen.

I've about decided that we have enough income (pensions) and after-tax savings to get us by 4 years until I'm eligible for full social security benefits, so I'm not going to look for another job. And Carol is going back to work at Haslett Schools. They called today and begged her to come back temporarily. The person who replaced her quit and left things in a mess. Part of the reason Carol agreed to go back is that she has a couple of good friends there.

I will be working on yard projects and doing some writing. Right now, I am hand-sanding the deck, or at least part of it. I bought a little electric sander, but I can't put my weight on it enough to really cut, so I'm doing it by hand, which allows me to put some muscle into it. Old, worn wood is starting to look like new.
