I got your letter yesterday along with 16 others the first mail we had had since about Dec 18 the reason being that we had been a little busy around here for the last few weeks and hadn't had time to operate our H.P.O.

The package came through OK and got here two days ago, thank, we get a lot of kick out of getting them we really don't want for a lot but just getting things from home always helps. The days are never long because there is always plenty to do but when we are out of the line the evenings and nights get long as there is never any place to go.

Christmas wasn't too lonesome this year as we were busy as hell and it was just another day to us and ~~when~~ when we are busy we lose all

track of the date - week or month.
it is just another day Sundays and
all. But again it is better that way
because with days of nothing to do we
have time to sit and think which
is not good in this business.

I would sure love to be home with
all the kids and you folks for a while
but I guess that won't happen for a
while at least. My Robin will be a
big girl by the time I get home, I
miss her and Bert a lot.

and have received the highest praise
for which I am most happy, just
like a dad and his family.
