I like the work even more than I did
before. We spent Friday observing in the tuberculosis
Clinic - When I see what Detroit is doing, and what
a grand job it is I shudder to think of the
conditions in other towns where far less effort is
being made to take care of the situation. From
a health viewpoint I believe Detroit is the best town
in the U.S. to live in. I found out last week that
I go to Charlevoix County for the month of April -
I go to Antwerp, Irenia to Otsego, and a girl from
Iowa whom we like to Kalkaska.
